

DIRECTORS

FIRST ANNUAL REPORT.

The Directors of All Saints' Hospital, Kansas City, present to their friends and the public their first Annual Report.

This Hospital is the property of "The Church Charity Association," which obtained its charter from the State of Missouri, October 3d, 1882. The objects of the Association are "to conduct a charity and pay Hospital, an Orphan Asylum and other enterprises of public benevolence, and in or near Kansas City, Jackson county, Missouri, to provide for and maintain said Hospital and other charities, and to furnish gratuitous medical and surgical aid to such poor, sick, indigent and distressed persons as may the regulations prescribed by the Board of Directors become inmates of the Hospital," etc.

A lot of ground 100 feet front and 160 deep was purchased on Campbell street, south of 10th street. On the 7th of May, 1883, the corner stone was laid, and on the 10th of May, 1885, the building was publicly dedicated to the purposes for which it was erected.

The building is the northern wing of the whole design, which contemplates the addition of another wing and central entrance tower. The wing erected is a three-story and basement building, 36 ft. front and 77 ft. depth, containing in all thirty-two rooms. There are two wards, accommodating fourteen beds each, and twelve rooms for private patients, making a total accommodation for patients of forty beds. The building is well situated, on high ground, well constructed and properly venti-

lated. It is a cheerful, bright place. The cost of the land was \$2,700; the cost of the building, \$15,000. It is subject to a mortgage of \$5,000.

It would require a volume to tell of the struggles and sacrifices made by the originators of this work to bring it to its present state. In the autumn of 1880, Miss Mary A. Fitzgerald (now Sister Isabel) having determined to devote her life and energies to charity and religion, decided to turn her attention to hospital work. To her efforts we are mainly indebted for our success. She commenced soliciting subscriptions. The merchants of Kansas City gave liberally, and all classes contributed generously of their means, in order that a long felt want might be supplied. The sister visited, also, Eastern cities and procured in them a large per cent. of her subscriptions.

The first patient was received into the Hospital on the 11th of May, 1885. From that day, until May 11th, 1886, the total number received was 206. The daily average has been 16; the average of days per patient, 27 $\frac{1}{2}$; the total number of days of treatment, 5,698; the total cash expenditures (not including cost of property, interest, &c.) has been \$4,450, making the cash expenditure per diem for each patient, 78 1-10 cents. This includes supply of drugs, household furniture, medical and surgical supplies. But does not include articles donated in kind. The estimated value of these is \$192.28, which would make the cost \$1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents.

We have not been able to work our Hospital to its fullest capacity for want of means. An institution of this kind must be made to win the confidence and support of the charitable public before it can do its full work. We depend on voluntary contributions for our ability to take charity patients. Were these contributions larger we could keep our wards constantly full. The contributions in money last year were \$1,141. We hope the work of the year past will win for us a more generous support in the year to come.

We have built one wing of the Hospital: we have carried it through the first year of its practical work successfully, and

shown that it is an institution that is needed in this locality. There remain now three things to be done: First, to secure a larger income for the support of the Hospital, that we may keep our wards constantly full of free patients; and to this end we earnestly solicit monthly or yearly subscriptions, large or small, from all into whose hands this report shall come. Second, to pay off the incumbrance on the property; and thirdly, to commence a fund for the completion of the building. That we may accomplish these two purposes we ask for gifts and bequests from all who are willing and able to make them.

In support of our appeal we advance three statements, viz: 1st, that this Hospital is remarkably well conducted--almost without exception,* the patients we have had during the past year have expressed (and some of them warmly) their gratification at the comfort, kindness and cheerfulness which surrounded their stay; 2d, that the hospital is greatly needed in Kansas City, and because of the rapid growth of the town will be needed more and more; 3d, that a hospital located in this place is a priceless boon to a large stretch of country, north, west and south of us. A very large number of the cases treated last year were difficult surgical cases, sent in from towns from fifty to four hundred miles distant, to this city, that they might secure the services of the skillful surgeons of this place. Kansas City is in many respects the great center of an enormous district, and not less in this than in other respects.

The members of the Church Charity Association are mostly (though not exclusively) members of the church known as the Protestant Episcopal Church, but the Hospital is by the charter required to be, and in fact is, open to all without distinction of sect or religion.
