DIRECTORS' REPORT.

THE Directors of All Saints Hospital submit to the Public the Medical and Financial Report for the fourth year of its good work. The number of patients is the same as last year, 394, which does not indicate a want of growth in the usefulness of the hospital. The fact that this year shows no increase in the number of patients admitted is due to a cause, for which we may be thankful—the very remarkable healthiness of the community during the past year, a condition of things well known to all who have had opportunity to observe, and indicated also by the fact that our medical cases fall fifty-seven short of last year, while the surgical cases show an increase of fifty-three over last year. The total of deaths has been twenty-one—a rate of $5\frac{1}{3}$ per hundred. The total expenses having been \$9,154.92. The actual house expenses (excluding interest on mortgage etc.) have been \$8,402.46, an increase of \$745.19 on the previous year. The total number of days of treatment has been 8,175. The expense of each patient per diem was \$1.03. A comparison made with some reports of hospitals in other cities both west and east has informed us that the expense in All Saints is exceedingly moderate—in some cases but half that of other places, and yet there is no complaint of room, food or insufficient service.

Our Hospital has been well conducted. The patients have been satisfied. The nurses have been faithful to such a degree as to claim special commendation. Sister Isabel has suffered much from ill health, but clung to her work and kept the house in excellent condition.

Our thanks are due to the King's Daughters and the Fruit and Flower Mission for gifts of flowers. In every part of the

house, men's ward as well as women's, flowers are always acceptable.

An item of \$250, bills payable, indicates our excess of expenditure over receipts. We must again ask for large contributions, not only that present expenses may be met, but also that we may increase the extent of our charity work. Our desire is to receive all the charity patients possible, our only limits are our means and our accomodations—the latter have thus far exceeded the former. Our charity work in the past year has been about 20 per cent. of the whole number of patients. Had we the means we would make it fifty per cent.
