



## DIRECTORS' REPORT.

THE Directors of All Saints' Hospital present to the Public their Fifth Annual Report of the work Surgical, Medical and Financial. The Hospital has maintained its good work as efficiently as before. Many and hearty have been the expressions of gratitude for their treatment from the patients; and frequent have been the commendations of doctors who have placed patients in the house. The one thing wanted is money. The contributions for the support of the Hospital, small as they have been in the past, have fallen off this year. The cash contributions, with the dues of the members, amounted to \$1,426.31. The total receipts have been \$7,780.85; expenditures, \$8,340 60; leaving a deficiency of \$559.75. We congratulate ourselves upon our death rate. The total number of patients was 365, deaths 12, making a rate of .03 $\frac{1}{3}$ .

We append to this report a list of the members of the Church Charity Association. This is the Association which owns the Hospital and elects the Directors. Members are elected into it at the regular meetings in March, July and November. They pay \$5.00 per annum dues in support of the Hospital. An effort is being made to enlarge the membership and thereby increase the income arising from dues. There is no reason why the membership should not be 300 or 400, yielding an income of \$1,500 or \$2,000. The Directors appeal to all to whom this report shall come, to join themselves and bring in their friends, to help on this good work.
